POOL RULES AND REGULATIONS of THE RESERVE CLUB

- 1. Only Applicants, their immediate family members and their guests are allowed to use the recreational facilities of THE RESERVE CLUB ("Club"). The Bylaws, Application and Renewal Rules and the Guest Policy should be reviewed if there is a question as to persons entitled to use the facilities.
- 2. The Club is not responsible for any lost or stolen personal property of any person using Club facilities. Personal property remaining on Club facilities and unclaimed for a period of two weeks will be disposed of by the Club without liability to the owner or any other person.
- 3. Persons using Club facilities must sign in as they arrive and wear identification tags while using Club facilities. Identification tags will be furnished by the Club to Members but all persons in a particular Membership are responsible for the safekeeping of the tags until their membership is transferred or terminated. Replacement tags will be issued at a replacement cost as determined from time to time by the Board of Directors.
- 4. There will be no swimming in swimming pools at any time unless a life guard is on duty.
- 5. No food, glass bottles or glass containers are allowed on the deck area.
- 6. Trash should be deposited in trash containers and persons using Club facilities must assure that they leave the facility in as good, if not better, condition than when they arrived.
- 7. No running is allowed on the pool deck.
- 8. Swimming in cut-offs or other attire not designed as swim wear is not permitted.
- 9. Anyone using the pool must shower before entering the water, particularly after sun bathing. All lotion and suntan oil must be washed off before entering the water.
- 10. Swimmers must be able to swim face-down, with a crawl stroke, across the pool in order to be allowed to swim in the deep end of the pool.
- 11. Children not able to physically perform the requirements of item #10 above must be accompanied by an adult while in the water. Adults are solely responsible for the welfare and safety of their children
